### FROM THE DIRECTOR'S NOTES - JENNY LAVERY

When I taught Pre-K – 2nd graders, Barbara Park's Junie B. series was a classroom staple and one that I thoroughly enjoyed reading with kids. Parks' beautifully captured the way that young children's minds work: the way they play with language and make rapid fire connections between the bits and bobs of new knowledge. Allison Gregory has masterfully taken the humor, the kid logic, and the heart that is ever present in the Junie B. book series and crafted a wonderfully theatrical new piece that centers on facing your fears and finding your own joy.

'The first one.' 'The only one.' Being singled out can be exhilarating! But it also can be scary and lonely, depending on the situation. In Junie B, Toothless Wonder, Junie B. wrestles with these complicated feelings of being singled out and left out. She tries nearly everything to entice others into including her. And when she finally succeeds, she must ask herself an even bigger question: what do I actually want? That can be a hard question to answer at any age.

I'm personally inspired by the bravery that Junie B. displays as she learns to confront her fears head on. It takes bravery to own your individuality, to think your own thoughts, and make decisions that are right for you. I hope that regardless of your age, you're able to take inspiration from Junie B. to have the courage to face your fears as they come and make decisions that make you feel good.

It has been a true delight collaborating with Allison, the creative team, and the production team here at Magik to bring this world premiere to the stage. In this case, being the first one is the absolute best!

### FROM THE PLAYWRIGHT'S NOTES - ALLISON GREGORY

### WHY I LOVE JUNIE B. JONES

- 1.) Junie B. isn't afraid to look bad. This girl says what's on her mind and doesn't spend a lot of time worrying about failing or how she comes off. I wish I were half as awesome as her.
- 2.) She speaks like real children think. Junie B. is an expressionist: she seeks to interpret the world from her inner perspective. Her misappropriation of words frankly conveys emotional meaning more accurately than "acceptable" language.
- 3.) Junie B. stories make really great plays. I'm intrigued by stories that offer an inner dilemma with an outer obstacle: a moral quandary that will determine an action taken (or denied). In Junie B., Toothless Wonder, our imperfect hero must grapple with the fear of losing a tooth and being 'deformed', plus the humiliation of being the only kid in class who didn't get invited to a classmate's birthday party. That's a lot for a kid (spoiler alert: she doesn't handle it in a dignified way).
- 4.) The stories are honest; the characters are real. There is a truthfulness to each narrative. No matter how hairbrained Junie B.'s antics or flawed her thinking, there is always a compelling reason for her to do what she does and always a dire consequence that requires her to respond. Yet she manages to call up some unexpected well of goodness within, and that's what I find so joyful about these stories and Junie B. herself: her scrappy resourcefulness, her unbridled sense of fairness, her zest, her imagination.

### ANTHONY RUNFOLA Artistic Director



**Anthony Runfola** (*Artistic Director*) is in his second season with Magik and is excited to be leading the company into its bright future.

His directing credits at Magik Theatre include Ella Enchanted, Snow White, Maddi's Fridge, and Señora Tortuga. Other recent productions include The Lion, the Witch, and the Wardrobe, Wonderland: Alice's Rock and Roll Adventure, Goodnight Moon, Charlotte's Web,

Eric and Elliot, The Neverending Story, and the world premieres of Interrupting Vanessa and Rock the Presidents (national tour). His production of Schoolhouse Rock Live! will be on its second national tour throughout 2021 and '22. He has been a guest artist at theatres and colleges throughout the country including Black Theatre Troupe, Actors Theatre of Phoenix, Teatro Bravo, Stray Cat Theatre, Phoenix Theatre, Gammage/ASU Public Events, Scottsdale and Mesa Community Colleges, Geva Theatre Center, and Seattle Children's Theatre.

Prior to arriving at Magik, Anthony was the Director of Production at Childsplay in Tempe, Arizona, where he oversaw the production of over 150 plays and musicals during his 20-year tenure. Additionally, he led the development of *El Puente* Festival and was a founding co-chair of the company's Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion committee. In 2010, he founded the Sustainable Stagecraft Initiative researching and developing sustainable practices for theatrical production. He has been invited to speak on the subject at conferences throughout the nation.

He is a founding member of Upstairs Theatre Company in Tucson, AZ and served as the company's artistic director until 2001. In 2015, he was accepted into the inaugural cohort of ArtEquity. Theatre Communications Group selected him as one of 50 U.S. theatre practitioners to participate in *I Am Theatre*, a web series celebrating pivotal moments in the lives of theatre-makers. He is an alumnus of the Lincoln Center Theater Directors Lab and Director's Lab West at the Pasadena Playhouse.

Along with his family, he is a recent transplant to San Antonio (arriving in 2020) and is looking forward to *finally* getting to explore the city!

### **ALLISON GREGORY Playwright**



**Allison Gregory's** plays have been produced nationally and internationally. She has been recognized by TYA USA as "One of the 10 Most Produced Theatre for Young Audiences Playwrights". Her plays include *Go Dog. Go!*, adapted from the P.D. Eastman book and co-written with Steven Dietz; *Even Steven Goes to War* ("Zoni" Best New Script Award; AATE and UPRP awards; Kennedy Center New Visions/New Voices selection); *Peter and the Wolf* (National tour); *Junie B. in* 

Jingle Bells, Batman Smells!, and Junie B. is Not A Crook, adapted from the beloved book series by Barbara Park; and Ronia, the Robber's Daughter, adapted from the Astrid Lindgren book. Her rowdy new adaptation of Red Riding Hood just had its premier at Seattle Children's Theatre.

Jenny Lavery (Director) is an Austin-based director, producer, educator, and performer who champions new works. She is the Founding Producing Artistic Director of Austin's Theatre en Bloc and the Programming Director of the Austin Creative Alliance. Some directing credits include: ROE (Zach); Dance Nation, Severe Weather Warning, The Secretary, Neva, Until the Flood, The Drowning Girls, The Totalitarians, Bright Half Life (Theatre en Bloc); Fly Girl

(Color Arc Productions); Red Bike (UT Austin); Art (Preas Theatre); and readings of Incident at Willow Creek, Backstory (San Antonio Public Theatre) and Look Back to Where I'm Sitting and I'm Gone (Hyde Park Theatre). Jenny holds a BFA from NYU, an M.Ed. from the Boston Teacher Residency / UMass, and an Executive Strategy for Non-Profit Management Certification from the University of Pennsylvania. Jenny is an SDC Associate member.



TWENTY shows with Magik Theatre?! Wowie-wow-WOW, I'm one lucky duck

I am often struck with just how fortunate I am to get to do what I do. Of course, I'd always enjoyed performing, but I wasn't very familiar with Theatre for Young Audiences until Magik Theatre, after seeing the faces of the children light up when I waved to them after my first performance here, I knew I was part of something really special.

I'll never forget the time when I recognized a family that had been to 4 or 5 of the shows I'd performed in, and the mother said to me, "I hope you know, my children are growing up watching YOU!" What a privilege to be able to tell these stories and be part of something that can make a lasting positive impression on a child's life! I'm incredibly humbled and grateful.

Fun facts about some shows I've performed at Magik Theatre:

First Show: Twas the Night Before Christmas, 2016

Most Number of Roles Played in One Production: 6, in Madagascar (2018)

Number of Animal Characters: 8 (if a dragon counts!)

Most Recurring Role: Woodstock in A Charlie Brown Christmas (2017, 2018, 2019)

One of the Hardest: Trixie in Knuffle Bunny — all of her lines were pure gibberish, which made memorization incredibly difficult!

### Most Memorable Show Mishaps:

During my very first preview in front of an audience at Magik Theatre ('Twas the Night Before Christmas), I did a choreographed silly frog leap over a stool... but this time, my pants split right down the middle!

Once while playing Thing 2 in The Cat in the Hat, my large blue wig flew off after doing a flip! I grabbed it and ran offstage, but had to come back on riding a bike almost immediately.



So, I did the most Thing 2 I could think to do: I held it in front of me as I rode across the stage, and screamed, "Oh no! I think I hit a blue squirrel!"



### BARBARA CONDOS

Barbara Virginia Seale Condos was born in Kenedy, Texas to her parents, Bess Ainsworth Seale and John Edgar Seale. Barbara passed away on her 97th birthday on February 24, 2022 at her home of 60+ years in Terrell Hills.

Barbara graduated from Alamo Heights High School and obtained her Bachelor of Fine Art degree in Music from the University of the Incarnate Word. After graduating from Incarnate Word, Barbara studied acting and dance in New York. Upon her return to San Antonio, Barbara opened her own ballet studio and taught ballet for many years, putting on a number of dance productions with her students. She also served as President of the San Antonio Ballet Association in the 1970's.

Barbara's artistic endeavors also included theatre and painting. As a painter, Barbara used oils, watercolors, and charcoal, and she exhibited her works in various galleries and art shows. To inaugurate the opening of Barclays Bank in Chicago, the bank sponsored a one-woman exhibition for Barbara at the bank's downtown banking lobby in 1974. As an actress, Barbara appeared in a number of amateur productions across San Antonio. After one of Barbara's acting performances at the Arneson River Theatre on the Riverwalk in 1955, she met her future husband, native New Yorker, George James Condos. Three months later they were married on Christmas Eve.

Outside of Barbara's real estate career, she continued to serve her community by championing education and the arts. During the 1980's, Barbara served on the board at University of the Incarnate Word, and she was recognized by then University President, Dr. Louis Agnese, as a distinguished alumna of the University. In 1987, Barbara was selected by her dear friend, Russell Rogers, as a trustee of the Russell Hill Rogers Fund for the Arts where she served for 24 years. Additionally, Barbara served on the board of trustees at the McNay Art Museum during the late 1980's and 1990's. Barbara remained active with the museum for many years as a trustee emeritus serving as a volunteer on the Art Committee and the Buildings and Grounds Committee.

Barbara Condos touched thousands of lives with her support of the arts and culture. She will always be remembered for her passion and generosity, as well as her kind spirit that touched everyone she met. We will miss her dearly.
