

Discuss how you could transform this piece of coal. Use your imagination and your art skills to create something new. Make sure to include the shape of the coal into your design!





SUPPLIES LIST:

- An Apple
- Red or Green Food Coloring
- Dish Soap (Apple scented for extra flair)
- 1-2 Tbsp of Baking Soda
- 2-3 cups of Vinegar
- Tray
- Melon Baller

PROCEDURES:

Step 1: Make a Hypothesis


Step 2: Cut a hole in top of apple (A melon baller works great for this!)

Step 3: In a separate container, mix dish soap, vinegar, and food coloring.

Step 4: Put carved apples on the tray

Step 5: Pour mixture into the top of the apple

Step 6: Watch and document what happens!
