

URBAN WILDLIFE: SQUIRRELS!

Observation at Magik! 🔎

In *Elephant & Piggie's "We Are in a Play!"*, we see the Squirrelles dance and hear them sing! You may be able to watch squirrels off the stage around our city, and even around Magik Theatre in Hemisfair's parks! Due to **urbanization**, or the increase in human population and development, squirrels have been faced with new challenges that urban environments pose. Let's take a closer look at how squirrels thrive as urban wildlife!



NEW THINGS TO CLIMB!

One key adaptation is squirrels' ability to exploit human-made structures such as buildings, bridges, and power lines as pathways for travel and nesting sites.

Let's Observe:

What do you see squirrels climbing on? What types of human made materials do you think would be easier or more difficult for squirrels to climb on? Why?

AW NUTS!

Another adaptation is squirrels' ability to exploit non-traditional food sources such as discarded food items or <u>bird feeders</u> found in parks or residential areas. Their small hands and sharp teeth help them to open discarded food containers, climb into garbage cans, as well as chew through plastic packaging! They are also highly opportunistic feeders and will adjust their diet based on what is available at any given time.

Let's Observe:

What do you notice the squirrels around you eating? Do you think this food source existed in their natural woodland environment or is it a food source created by humans?

WATCH OUT!


Squirrels have also learned to modify their behavior to avoid human hazards. New urban environments bring new dangers to navigate. Cars are a major threat, and squirrels have learned to be sensitive to the sound of oncoming vehicles.

Although urban squirrels may seem more friendly to humans, they generally avoid close contact. They also face the threat of domestic dogs and cats as additional predators to watch out for.

After observing our urban wildlife friends, circle the below survival strategies that you notice squirrels practicing!






These adaptations demonstrate not only squirrels' resilience but also their intelligence in navigating new environmental challenges presented by an increasingly urbanized world.

HOW TO MAKE FRIENDSHIP BRACELETS

Elephant and Piggie are the best of friends and they love showing their friendship in fun ways—now you can too! Follow these simple steps to make your own friendship bracelet.ctions below to make a friendship bracelet to show off your friendships!

WHAT YOU'LL NEED:

- Embroidery floss/thin yarn
- Scissors
- Tape or pins/safety pins

Step 1: Measure & Cut

Cut a piece of floss/yarn about 30 inches long (from your fingertips to your shoulder).

Step 2: Choose Your Strands

Use six strands to start-it's easier to keep track of!

Step 3: Begin Your Bracelet

- Tie a knot at one end of your strands.
- Tape or pin it to a flat surface.
- Braid about 3 inches down, then tie another knot.

Step 4: Knotting the Bracelet

- Arrange your strands in the order you like.
- Take the first strand and loop it over and then under the second strand.
- Pull the first strand up toward the top knot (but not too tight!).
- Repeat the knot once more on the same strand.
- Move to the next strand and repeat until you've knotted across the bracelet.
- Start again from the left and continue knotting until your bracelet is 3–4 inches long.


Step 5: Finishing the Bracelet

- Tie a knot at the end of the knotted section.
- Braid another 3 inches and tie one last knot.
- Trim the extra floss/yarn.

Now your friendship bracelet is ready to wear or share! 💙

HOW TO MAKE ICE CREAM AT HOME

Ice cream is a frozen dessert that is typically made from sweetened and flavored milk or cream. It is typically made in a machine called a churn. However, through the magic of science you can make ice cream at home in a bag! Follow the video below to find out how!



HOW IT WORKS:

Pure water freezes at 0 degrees Celsius. Add salt and the freezing point drops by a few degrees. When you add salt to the ice in the outer bag, the ice (at 0°C) is now above its freezing point – so it begins to melt.

Melting requires energy, and in this case that energy comes from the flavoured milk mixture in the inner bag. Ice crystals start to grow in-between the tiny globules of fat in the milk and bubbles of air, causing the milk to freeze and change state from a liquid to a solid.


Using the cutouts in the next page and prompt below, create a scene with a partner about Elephant and Piggie!

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


1. Choose and cut around the shape of your character's head

Some questions you may hear are...

- Elephant and Piggie are best friends who love to do everything together! What is something you like to do with your friends?
- Piggie is nervous to go to the Squirrelle's party because she's never been to a party before. **Have you ever been nervous about trying something new?**
- Elephant and Piggie have a big argument after Elephant accidentally breaks Piggie's toy. Have you ever disagreed with a friend before? What did you do to come to a solution?
- Sometimes we say things to a friend that we don't mean and this can hurt their feelings. How would you approach a friend who's feelings you may have hurt?



Think about some questions you'd like to ask about the show, like how or why we did something! We will give you the opportunity to ask some of those questions.
