SUMMARY DESCRIPTION:

Magik Theatre Teaching Artists are local artists dedicated to helping students grow as artists while fostering collaboration and emotional intelligence. Through ongoing training in trauma-informed care, arts integration, social-emotional learning, and scaffolded theatre education aligned with Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills (TEKS), Teaching Artists deliver engaging, age-appropriate instruction in schools and community settings. They implement curriculum aligned with program goals, create safe and inclusive learning environments, and serve as ambassadors of Magik Theatre by collaborating closely with education staff, site partners, and fellow artists.

RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Prepare and deliver engaging, high-quality arts instruction aligned with Magik Theatre values
- Assist in planning and facilitating integrated lessons
- Utilize theatre and TEKS resources to create a creative and stimulating learning environment
- Maintain a safe, supportive, and inclusive environment for all students

Professional Conduct

- Adhere to all communication expectations, including prompt responses to professional emails and messages

- Represent The Magik Theatre with professionalism at all times when interacting with students, staff, and site partners

Attendance & Communication

- Attend all scheduled classes, orientations, and meetings related to your assignment
- If an unexpected conflict arises, notify Education Administrators at least 24 hours in advance whenever possible

Preferred Qualifications

- Experience as a Teaching Artist or Arts Educator, including developing and facilitating curriculum for young people, required
- Ability to use effective classroom management techniques to create a positive, safe, inclusive, and supportive learning environment for every student
- Highly organized with excellent communication skills and the ability to work both independently and collaboratively
- Flexibility and willingness to problem-solve and adapt the curriculum based on the needs of students
- Strong interest in and passion for ongoing personal growth and professional development as a Teaching Artist
- Familiarity with Trauma-Informed Care (TIC), social-emotional learning, and inclusive teaching practices is a plus
- Experience with after-school or in-school residency programs
- Bilingual or multilingual abilities

Physical & Environmental Requirements

- Ability to actively engage with students and facilitate classes for their full duration, with or without reasonable accommodations.
- Ability to lift and carry materials (up to approximately 25 lbs)
- Willingness to travel to assigned sites
- Ability to receive and comprehend instructions verbally and/or in writing
- Ability to use logical reasoning for simple and complex problem-solving
